

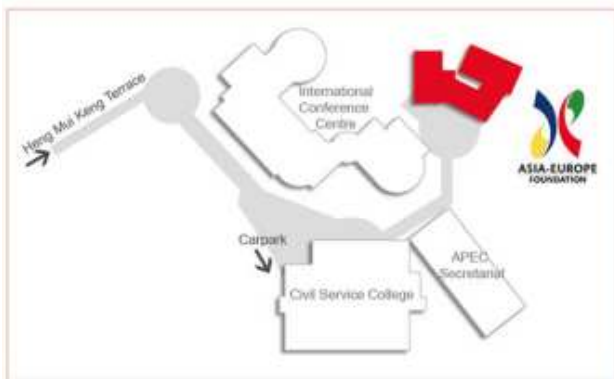


31 Heng Mui Keng Terrace
